## ORANGE SET: PALATAL SWELLING CASE

Cluster 1: Clinical Information Gathering

## Key Words

1

### HISTORY

- HOPC: Any concerns with teeth? Swelling - When did it first appear? Any symptoms with it? Is it increasing in size?
- Medical history - medical conditions, medications and allergies. Last blood test? Blocked nose/ sinus issues?
- Dental history - Previous dental visits. Details about the filling.
- Oral hygiene history - Toothbrushing? Flossing?
- Social history - Grinding? Smoking? Alcohol?

2

### D/D:

Dental/ gum abscess, sinus or salivary gland lesions. Significance of regular visits because of important structures around the mouth.

### INVESTIGATIONS:

- E/O - Check joints and muscles of mastication.
- I/O - Detailed examination of all teeth  
X-rays: Bitewings and OPG. Maybe PA or occlusal.  
Probing/ Gum examination.  
Referral to GP for blood test.  
Referral to an oral medicine specialist for biopsy.

## Key Words

1

### HISTORY

- HOPC: How and when were the teeth lost? Any concerns? Any replacement and it's details? Any perio symptoms?
- Medical history - medical conditions, medications and allergies. Last blood test?
- Dental history - Previous dental visits.
- Oral hygiene history - Toothbrushing? Flossing?
- Social history - Grinding? Smoking? Alcohol?

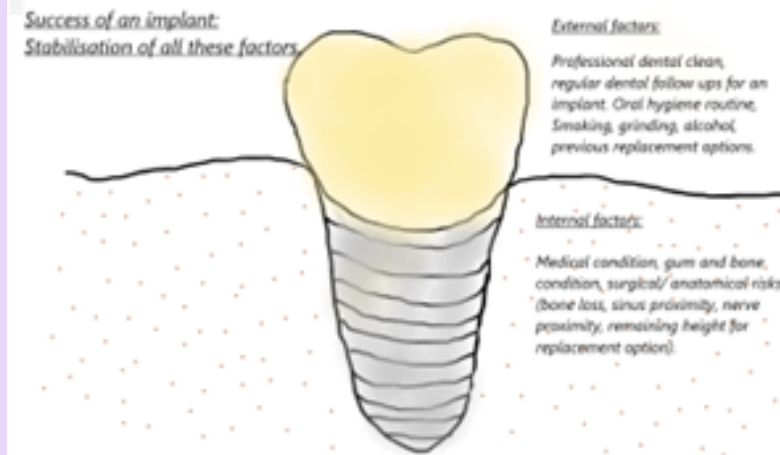
Explain implant and determinants for it's success.

### INVESTIGATIONS:

- E/O - Check joints and muscles of mastication.  
Swelling over the face.
- I/O - X-rays: OPG and PA.  
Probing/ Gum examination.  
Referral to GP for blood test.  
Referral to an oral surgeon for surgical consideration before implant.

UNCOOPERATIVE CHILD**

Cluster 2: Diagnosis and Management

## Key Words

- 1** HOPC: Pain details and if it's affecting sleep or eating habits? Swelling?
- 2** **EXPLANATION OF FINDINGS:**  
Reversible pulpitis (most probably).
- 3** **RELEVANT HISTORY:**  
Regular dental visits, oral hygiene, diet.
- 4** **TREATMENT AND EVALUATION:**
  - No treatment.
  - Immediate t/t: Tell-show-do, distraction techniques to take the patient out of a painful situation.
  - Long term treatment: Comprehensive treatment with a pedodontist in a single appointment.
  - VPTAS (If remote area)
- 5** **HEALTH PROMOTION ASPECTS:**
  - Regular dental visits - brochures of dental camps in rural/ remote areas.
  - Oral hygiene routine (Brushing twice daily, flossing, supervision and fluoride toothpaste).
  - Diet modification and water intake.

AND UNCONTROLLED DIABETES**

Cluster 2: Diagnosis and Management

## Key Words

- 1** HOPC: Pain details and if it's affecting sleep or eating habits? Swelling extent? Assess for severe features.
- 2** **EXPLANATION OF FINDINGS:**  
Spreading odontogenic infection with systemic and without severe features. (Most probably).
- 3** **RELEVANT HISTORY:**  
Medical history (last blood test), smoking, alcohol.
- 4** **TREATMENT AND EVALUATION:**
  - No treatment.
  - Immediate t/t: Pulpectomy. (check if the patient has eaten).
  - Permanent treatment: Referral to GP and oral surgeon before extraction because of complications (uncontrolled DM and OAC).
  - Review: Recall, discuss replacement options and complete check

Cluster 3: Clinical Treatment and Evaluation

## Key Words

- 1** HOPC: Change within pain intensity? Any trigger - eating hard foodstuffs or grinding? Swelling?
- 2** Explanation of findings on x-ray and diagnosis.
- 3** **RELEVANT HISTORY:**  
Grinding.
- 4** **TREATMENT AND EVALUATION:**
  - No treatment.
  - Emergency treatment: 1st stage of RCT.
  - Permanent treatment: RCT followed by crown by me or RCT by endodontist
- 5** Patient has the right to complain. Suggest having a word with a colleague first, otherwise walk through the complaint procedure yourself or with the manager. AHPRA.

## Key Words

- 1** HOPC: Pain details and if it's affecting sleep or eating habits? Swelling extent? Assess for severe features.
- 2** Explanation of findings on x-ray and diagnosis.
- 3** **RELEVANT HISTORY:**  
If a patient is carrying an asthma inhaler, and other M/H.
- 4** **TREATMENT AND EVALUATION:**
  - No treatment.
  - Emergency treatment: Referral to hospital for medical attention. Maybe extraction by an onboard oral surgeon.
- 5** **HEALTH PROMOTION:**  
Regular dental visits.
